| Prov-23:<br>29-35 | K/V- 30.             | <b>Those who linger long at the wine,</b> Those who go in search of mixed wine.  |
| Prov-31:<br>1-7   | K/V- 6.              | <b>Give strong drink to him who is perishing,</b> And wine to those who are bitter of heart.   |

| Ezek-44:<br>20-22 | K/V- 21.             | <b>“No priest shall drink wine when he enters the inner court. (1-Peter-2:8-10.<sup>9</sup>)</b>   |
| Nahum-1:<br>10-11 | K/V- 10.             | <b>For while tangled like thorns, And while drunken like drunkards,</b> They shall be devoured like stubble fully dried.   |
| Habb-2:<br>15-16  | K/V- 15.             | <b>“Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbour,</b> Pressing him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may look on his nakedness!  |
| Matt-24:<br>48-51 | K/V- 48.<br>K/V- 49. | <sup>48</sup> . <b>“But if that evil servant says in his heart, ‘My master is delaying his coming,’<sup>49</sup> ‘and begins to beat his fellow servants, and to eat and drink with the drunkards,</b>   |

| Luke-21:<br>34-36 | K/V- 34.             | “But take heed to yourselves, <b>lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and the cares of this life,</b> and that Day come on you unexpectedly. (Matt-13:22.)  |
| Rom-13:<br>10-14  | K/V- 13.             | Let us walk properly, as in the day, <b>not in revelry and drunkenness,</b> not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy.  |
| Rom-14:<br>20-23  | K/V- 21.             | <b>It is good neither to eat meat nor drink wine nor do anything by which your brother stumbles or is offended or is made weak.</b>  |
| 1-Cor-5:<br>9-13  | K/V- 11.             | But now I have written to you not to keep company with anyone named a brother, who is sexually immoral, or covetous, or an idolater, or a reviler, <b>or a drunkard,</b> or an extortioner- not even to eat with such a person.  |
| 1-Cor-6:<br>9-11  | K/V- 10.             | <b>Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God. (Gal-5:19-21.<sup>21</sup>)</b>   |
| Eph-5:<br>17-18   | K/V- 18.             | <b>And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation;</b> (dissipation= means in access). But be filled with the Spirit.  |

| 1-Thes-5:<br>1-9  | K/V- 7.<br>K/V- 8.                       | <sup>7</sup> . <b>For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night.</b> <sup>8</sup> .<br>But let us who are of the day <b>be sober</b> , putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation.   |
| 1-Tim-3:<br>1-8   | K/V- 3.                                  | <b>Not given to wine</b> , not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous;  |
| 1-Tim-5:<br>23-25 | K/V-23.                                  | No longer drink only water, <b>but use a little wine for your stomach's sake and your frequent infirmities.</b>   |
| Titus-1:<br>7-9   | K/V-7.                                   | For a bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God, not self willed, not quick tempered, <b>not given to wine</b> , not violent, not greedy for money,   |
| Titus-2:<br>1-5   | K/V- 1.<br>K/V- 2.<br>K/V- 3.<br>K/V- 4. | <sup>1</sup> . But as for you, speak the things which are proper for sound doctrine: <sup>2</sup> . That the older men be sober, reverent, temperate, sound in faith, in love, in patience; the older women likewise, that they be reverent in behavior, not slanderers, <b>not given to much wine</b> , teachers of good things- <sup>4</sup> . | Gal-4:<br>9-11    | K/V- 9.  | But now after you have known God, or rather are known by God, how is it that you turn again to the weak and beggarly elements, to which you desire again to be in bondage?<br>(Prov-26:11.) (2-Peter-2:22.) |
