Gen-2: 24-25	K/V- 24.	Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh. (Matt-19:3-6. ^{5.}) (Mk-10:2-9. ^{7-9.}) (Eph-5:29-33. ^{31.})
Matt-5: 31-32	K/V- 32.	“But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality; causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery. (Lk-16:18.)
Matt-19: 3-12	K/V- 10.	His disciples said to Him, “If such is the case of the man with his wife, it is better not to marry. ” (Prov-21:19.)
Matt-22: 1-14	K/V- 2.	“ The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son.
Matt-22: 23-33	K/V- 30.	“ For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels of God in heaven. (Mk-12:18-27. ^{25.}) (Lk-20:27-40. ^{36.}) (1-Cor-15:44.) (Heb-12:22-23. ^{23.})
Matt-24: 35-44	K/V- 38.	“For as in the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage , until the day that Noah entered the ark, (Lk-17:26-27.) (Jn-4:16-18.)
Mark-6: 17-18	K/V- 17. K/V- 18.	For Herod himself had sent and laid hold of John, and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip’s wife; for he had married her. (Lev-18:16.)
Mark-10: 1-12	K/V- 11.	^{10.} And He said to them, “Whoever divorces his wife and marries another, commits adultery against her. ^{12.} “And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.” (1-Cor-6:9-11. ^{9.})
Luke-14: 16-24	K/V- 20.	“ Still another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come. ’
Rom-7: 1-6	K/V- 3.	So then if, while her husband lives, she marries another man, she will be called an adulteress; but if her husband dies, she is free from that law, so that she is no adulteress, though she has married another man.
1-Cor-7: 1-5	K/V- 3.	Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her, and likewise also the wife to her husband.
1-Cor-7: 6-9	K/V- 9.	---but if they cannot exercise self-control let them marry. For it is better to marry than to burn with passion.
1-Cor-7: 10-11	K/V- 10.	Now to the married I command, yet not I but the Lord: A wife is not to depart from her husband.
1-Cor-7: 12-17	K/V- 12.	But to the rest I, not the Lord, say: If any brother has a wife who does not believe, and she is willing to live with him, let him not divorce her.
1-Cor-7: 27-28	K/V- 28.	But even if you do marry, you have not sinned; and if a virgin marries, she has not sinned. Nevertheless such will have trouble in the flesh, but I would spare you.
1-Cor 7: 29-31	K/V- 29.	The time is short, so that from now on even those who have wives should be as though they had none. (Lk-14:20.) (1-Tim-2:11-15. ^{12.})
1-Cor-7: 31-38	K/V- 33.	But he who is married cares about the things of the world- how he may please his wife. (Rom-12:2.) (2-Tim-2:3-4.) (Jam-4:4.) (1-Jn-2:15-17.)
1-Cor-7: 39-40	K/V- 39.	A wife is bound by law as long as her husband lives; but if her husband dies, she is at liberty to be married to whom she wishes, only in the Lord.
Heb-13: 4-6	K/V- 4.	Marriage is honorable among all , and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge. (1-Cor-6:9-11.)
Rev-19: 7-10	K/V- 7.	“Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready. ”
