Psalm-78: 1-4	K/V- 2.	<b>I will open my mouth in a parable;</b> I will utter dark sayings of old, ( <u>Matt-13:34-35.</u> )
Ezek-24: 3-17	K/V- 3.	<b>“And utter a parable to the rebellious house,</b> and say to them, ‘Thus says the Lord God: ( <u>Matt-13:13.</u> )
Matt-5: 15-16	K/V- 15.	“Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, <b>but on a lamp stand, and it gives light to all who are in the house.</b> ( <u>Mk-4:21-22.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-8:16-18.</u> )
Matt-9: 16	K/V- 16.	<b>“No one puts a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old garment;</b> for the patch pulls away from the garment, and the tear is made worse. ( <u>Mk-2:21.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-5:36.</u> )
Matt-9: 17	K/V- 17.	<b>“Nor do they put new wine into old wineskins,</b> or else the wineskins, or else the wineskins break, the wine is spilled, and the wineskins are ruined. But they put new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved.” ( <u>Mk-2:22.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-5:37-39.</u> )
Matt-13: 3-23	K/V- 3.	<b>Then He spoke many things to them in parables,</b> saying: “Behold, a sower went out to sow. ( <u>Mk-4:2-20.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-8:4-18.</u> )
Matt-13: 24-30	K/V- 24. <u>Part-1.</u>	<b>Another parable He put forth to them,</b> saying: “The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed <b>good seed in his field;</b>
Matt-13: 36-43	K/V- 36. <u>Part- 2.</u>	Then Jesus sent the multitude away and went into the house. And His disciples came to Him, saying, <b>“Explain to us the parable of the tares of the field.”</b>
Matt-13: 31-32	K/V- 31.	<b>Another parable He put forth to them,</b> saying: “The kingdom of heaven is like a <b>mustard seed,</b> which a man took and sowed in his field, ( <u>Mk-4:30-32.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-13:18-19.</u> )
Matt-13: 33	K/V- 33.	<b>Another parable He spoke to them:</b> “The kingdom of heaven is like leaven, which a <b>woman took and hid in three measures</b> of meal till it was all leavened.” ( <u>Lk-13:20-21.</u> )
Matt-13: 34-35	K/V- 34.	<b>All these things Jesus spoke to the multitude in parables; and without a parable He did not speak to them,</b>
Matt-13: 44	K/V- 44.	<b>“Again, the kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in the field,</b> which a man found and hid; and for joy over it he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.
Matt-13: 45-46	K/V- 45. K/V- 46.	<sup>45</sup> . <b>“Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking beautiful pearls,</b> <sup>46</sup> . “Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had and brought it. ( <u>Matt-7:6.</u> )
Matt-13: 47-50	K/V- 47.	<b>“Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet that was cast into the sea and gathered some of every kind,</b>
Matt-18: 12-24	K/V- 12.	“What do you think? If a man has a hundred sheep, and one of them goes astray, <b>does he not leave the ninety-nine and go to the mountains to seek the one that is straying?</b> ( <u>Lk-15:3-7.</u> )
Matt-18: 23-35	K/V- 32.	“Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, ‘ <b>You wicked servant!</b> I forgave you all that debt because you begged me. ( <u>Matt-6:14-15.</u> ) ( <u>Mk-11:24-26.</u> )
Matt-20: 1-16	K/V- 1.	<b>“For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard.</b>
Matt-21: 28-32	K/V- 28.	“But what do you think? A man had two sons, and he came to the first and said, ‘Son, <b>go, work today in my vineyard.</b> ’
Matt-21: 33-45	K/V- 33.	<b>“Hear another parable:</b> There was a certain <b>landowner who planted a vineyard</b> and set a hedge around it, dug a winepress in it and built a tower. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country. ( <u>Mk-12:1-12.</u> ) ( <u>Lk-20:9-19.</u> )
Matt-22: 1-14	K/V- 2.	<b>“The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son.</b>

Matt-24: 32-33	K/V- 32.	<b>“Now learn this parable from the fig tree:</b> When its branch has already become tender and puts forth leaves, you know that summer is near. (Mk-13:28-29.) (Lk-21:29-31.)
Matt-25: 1-13	K/V- 1.	“Then the kingdom of heaven shall be likened to <b>ten virgins</b> who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom.
Matt-25: 14-30	K/V- 15.	<b>“And to one he gave five talents,</b> to another two, and to another one, to each according to his own ability; and immediately he went on a journey.
Matt-25: 31-46	K/V- 32.	“All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate them one from another, as a <b>shepherd divides his sheep from the goats.</b> (Matt-28:18.) (John-5:22.)
Mark-4: 26-29	K/V- 28.	<b>“For the earth yields crops by itself: first the blade, then the head, after that the full grain in the head.</b>
Mark-13: 34-37	K/V- 34.	“It is like a man going to a far country, <b>who left his house and gave authority to his servants,</b> and to each his work, and commanded the doorkeeper to watch.
Luke-7: 36-43	K/V- 41.	<b>“There was a certain creditor who had to debtors.</b> One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. (Matt-18:21-22.)
Luke-10: 25-37	K/V- 33.	<b>“But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was. And when he saw him, he had compassion.</b>
Luke-11: 5-10	K/V- 5.	And He said to them, “Which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at midnight and say to him, <b>‘Friend, lend me three loaves;</b>
Luke-12: 16-21	K/V- 20.	“But God said to him, <b>‘Fool! This night your soul will be required of you;</b> then whose will those things be which you have provided?’
Luke-12: 35-40	K/V- 40.	<b>“Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.”</b>
Luke-12: 42-48	K/V- 47.	“And that servant who knew his masters will, and did not prepare himself or do according to his will, <b>shall be beaten with many stripes.</b> (Matt-22:12-14.) (Lk-6:46.) (Rev-7:14.)
Luke-13: 6-9	K/V- 9.	<b>‘And if it bears fruit, well. But if not, after that you can cut it down.’</b> “ (John-15:6.)
Luke-14: 16-24	K/V- 18.	<b>“But they all with one accord began to make excuses.</b> The first said to him, ‘I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.’
Luke 15: 8-10	K/V- 8.	“Or what woman, having ten silver coins, <b>if she loses one coin,</b> does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it?
Luke-15: 11-32	K/V- 18.	‘I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, <b>“Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you,</b>
Luke-16: 1-13	K/V- 2.	“So he called him and said to him, ‘What is this I hear about you? <b>Give an account of your stewardship,</b> for you can no longer be steward.’
Luke-16: 19-31	K/V- 20.	<b>“But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus,</b> full of sores, who was laid at his gate, (Matt-25:31-46. <sup>45</sup> )
Luke-17: 7-10	K/V- 10.	“So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, <b>‘We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.’</b> “
Luke-18: 1-8	K/V- 8.	<b>“I tell you that He will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?”</b>
Luke-18: 9-14	K/V- 9. K/V- 10.	<sup>9</sup> Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: <sup>10</sup> <b>“Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.</b>
Luke-19: 11-27	K/V- 16.	<b>“Then came the first, saying, ‘Master, your mina has earned ten minas.’</b>
