| Matt-5: 27-28 | K/V- 28. | But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. |
| Matt-5: 31-32 | K/V- 32. | But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery. (Mk-10:2-12. ¹²) |
| Matt-9: 20-22 | K/V- 20. | And suddenly, a woman who had a flow of blood for twelve years came from behind and touched the hem of His garment. (Mk-5:25.) (Lk-8:43.) |
| Matt-11: 7-15 | K/V- 11. | "Assuredly, I say to you, among those born of women there has not risen one greater than John the Baptist; but he who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. (Lk-7:28.) (Matt-3:11.) (Matt-12:6-8.) |
| Matt-13: 33 | K/V- 33. | Another parable He spoke to them: " The kingdom of heaven is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal till it was all leavened. " (Lk-13:21.) |
| Matt-15: 21-28 | K/V- 28. | Then Jesus answered and said to her, " O woman, great is your faith! Let it be to you as you desire." And her daughter was healed from that very hour. |
| Matt-22: 23-33 | K/V- 27. | "Last of all the woman died also. (Mk-12:22.) (Lk-20:32.) |
| Matt-24: 35-51 | K/V- 41. | Two women will be grinding at the mill: one will be taken and the other left. (Lk-17:35.) (1-Cor-15:44.) (1-Cor-15:50.) |
| Matt-26: 6-13 | K/V- 7. | -a woman came to Him having an alabaster flask of very costly fragrant oil, and she poured it on His head as He sat at the table. (Mk-14:3.) (Lk-7:37.) |
| Matt-27: 55 | K/V- 55. | And many women who followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering to Him, were there looking on from afar, (Mk-15:40-41.) |
| Matt-28: 1-10 | K/V- 5. | But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. (Lk-24:1-10.) |
| Luke-1: 28-32 | K/V- 28. | And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women! " (Lk-1:42.) |
| Luke-8: 1-3 | K/V- 2. | -and certain women who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities-- Mary called Magdalene, out of whom had come seven demons, (Mk-16:9.) |
| Luke-10: 38-42 | K/V- 42. | But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her." |
| Luke-11: 27-28 | K/V- 27. | And it happened, as He spoke these things, that a certain woman from the crowd raised her voice and said to Him, "Blessed is the womb that bore You, and the breasts which nursed You!" |
| Luke-13: 10-17 | K/V- 12. | But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, " Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity. " |
| Luke-15: 8-10 | K/V- 8. | "Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? |
| Luke-23: 27-31 | K/V- 27. | And a great multitude of the people followed Him, and women who also mourned and lamented Him. |
| John-2: 1-11 | K/V- 4. | Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come." |
| John-4: 5-34 | K/V- 7. | A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink." |
| John-8: 1-11 | K/V- 4. | -they said to Him, " Teacher, this woman was caught in adultery, in the very act. |

| John-11: 1-46 | K/V- 19. | And many of the Jews had joined the women around Martha and Mary, to comfort them concerning their brother. |
| John-16: 19-21 | K/V- 21. | A woman, when she is in labor, has sorrow because her hour has come; but as soon as she has given birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. |
| John-19: 25-27 | K/V- 26. | When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing by, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold your son!" |
| John-20: 1-31 | K/V- 15. | Jesus said to her, " Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking? " She, supposing Him to be the gardener, said to Him, "Sir, if You have carried Him away, tell me where You have laid Him, and I will take Him away." |
| Acts-8: 12 | K/V- 12. | But when they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were baptized. |
| Acts-9: 36-43 | K/V- 36. | At Joppa there was a certain disciple named Tabitha, which is translated Dorcas. This woman was full of good works and charitable deeds which she did. |
| Rom-1: 24-32 | K/V- 26. | For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature. |
| Rom-7: 1-5 | K/V- 2. | For the woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives. But if the husband dies, she is released from the law of her husband. |
| 1-Cor-7: 1-16 | K/V- 2. | Nevertheless, because of sexual immorality, let each man have his own wife, and let each woman have her own husband. |
| 1-Cor-7: 32-34 | K/V- 34. | There is a difference between a wife and a virgin. The unmarried woman cares about the things of the Lord, that she may be holy both in body and in spirit. But she who is married cares about the things of the world--how she may please her husband. |
| 1-Cor-11: 1-16 | K/V- 3. | But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman is man, and the head of Christ is God. |
| 1-Cor-14: 34-38 | K/V- 34. | Let your women keep silent in the churches, for they are not permitted to speak; but they are to be submissive, as the law also says. <u>(1-Tim-2:11-15.)</u> |
| Gal-3: 27-29 | K/V- 28. | There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. |
| Gal-4: 1-4 | K/V- 4. | But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, |
| Gal-4: 26 | K/V- 26. | -but the Jerusalem above is free, which is the mother of us all. <u>(Jn-3:3-5.) (Jn-8:36.) (Gal-4:6.) (Rev-3:12.) (Rev-3:21.)</u> |
| Phil-4: 3-4 | K/V- 3. | And I urge you also, true companion, help these women who labored with me in the gospel, with Clement also, and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the Book of Life. |
| 1-Tim-2: 9-10 | K/V- 9. | -in like manner also, that the women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with propriety and moderation, not with braided hair or gold or pearls or costly clothing, |
| 1-Tim-2: 11-15 | K/V- 11. K/V- 12. | ¹¹ Let a woman learn in silence with all submission. ¹² And I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man, but to be in silence. <u>(1Cor-14:34.)</u> |
| 1-Tim-5: 2-7 | K/V- 2. | -older women as mothers, younger as sisters, with all purity. |
| 2-Tim-3: 5-7 | K/V- 6. | For of this sort are those who creep into households and make captives of gullible women loaded down with sins, led away by various lusts, |
| 1-Pet-3: 1-6 | K/V- 5. | For in this manner, in former times, the holy women who trusted in God also adorned themselves, being submissive to their own husbands, |
